#### A Note from the Pastor

#### Saints and Sinners

"Uriah left the palace, and a gift from the king was sent after him. However, Uriah slept at the palace entrance with all his master's servants. He didn't go down to his own house." 2 Samuel 11:8-9 CEB

Most of us are familiar with the story of King David and Bathsheba. We remember how David was on the rooftop of the palace and saw Bathsheba bathing. Even though she was married to Uriah, David was so enthralled with her that he had an affair with her and she became pregnant with his child. David tried to cover up the affair by having Uriah called home from battle to give a status report and encouraged him to go home and be with his wife. But Uriah stayed at the palace, and King David then planned for Uriah's murder to cover up David's sins.

At face value, this story is about the fall and redemption of Israel's favorite king. David sinned before God. He broke four of the 10 commandments. Thou shalt not covet, steal, murder, or commit adultery. The prophet Nathan confronted David concerning what he had done wrong, and although there were consequences, David repented and remained king. God forgave him.

But the question for me is Uriah. He was a faithful soldier in King David's army. He was so devoted to his king that instead of returning to his home, he slept at the entrance to the palace. In this story, Uriah does nothing wrong, and yet, he loses everything. Where is his justice?

The older I get the more I realize how imperfect this world we live in is. Regardless of how right or justly we live our lives, bad things still happen to good people. That is the price we pay for "free will." However, although God doesn't promise us the "perfect" life, He does promise that we will not live life alone. God is with us. That is what Emmanuel means. To live as a Christian doesn't mean that bad things will stop happening to us. It means that when they do, God walks with us, and we can depend upon His strength to carry us through just as I know God was with Uriah.

Our witness to the world, then, is one of hope and courage. It is a reminder that when one is going through the struggles of life, whether it is cancer, the loss of a job, family/marital problems, you name it, we do not walk alone. We do not have to rely on our strength alone. God is with us, willing to even carry us if we need.
